 This includes multiple steps, NOT JUST your online enrollment.
 So the sooner the better.
- Complete annual YQCA training
- Attend required hours of market project meetings
- Submit an up-to-date Annual Project Report
- Attend fair qualifier event
- Meet the ownership requirements for your animal
- Abide by the 4-H member code of conduct
- Submit completed <u>4-H Valley Fair contract</u> to the office by due date.



MONEY MATTERS

Money management is an issue that the University of California takes very seriously. The county 4-H office reviews each club's monthly bank statement to ensure that financial business is being handled according to policy, and that all appropriate measures are in place to facilitate review and deter any mishandling of funds. Here are a few pointers to help you keep your financial records in shape.

- 1. Statements are mailed directly to the County 4-H Office, who then emails the Club a copy.
- 2. Internet banking, electronic statements and check/debit/credit cards are not allowed.
- 3. Check images or cancelled checks *must* be included in your monthly statements *without exception*.
- 4. Be sure to include a memo on all checks written, describing the purpose for the expenditure.
- 5. Each check *must* have the signature of two *unrelated* signers.
- 6. The person to whom the check is made out to *cannot* sign the check.

Great News! The 4H Activity Tracker App is now available on both Google Play Store for Android and Apple for iPhone.

If you previously used it on Android, it should still be there. If you used it on

Apple, you will have to reinstall it, this was an interruption that we did not know would happen until it occurred.

It's a great tool for tracking 4-H activities that will be helpful for the new Activity summary form — and we will allow members to print out the activity tracker as their Activity Summary. This will be included in the Record Book Manual explanations.

A 4-H Record Book is a standard record of your activities in 4-H - your projects, activities, events, skills development and learning experiences. The 4-H Record Book helps you improve your skills in record keeping, goal management and reflection on your achievements and growth in 4-H. You can submit your record book for evaluation at the club, county and state levels.

The Record Book and Achievement Programs are optional and separate programs. We highly recommend you take advantage of both programs to maximize your growth and learning in 4-H.
