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5th Annual 4-H/FFA Community BBQ - July 3



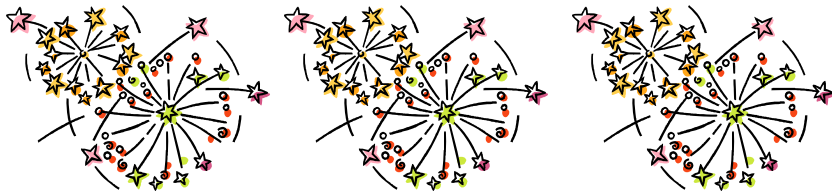

Anyone wishing to sponsor a medal(s) for \$3/each can do so by contacting the 4-H office.

Requirements:

- ◆ All clubs must provide 1 judge for every 5 books submitted, one must be a leader (community or project).
- ◆ Gold seals are to be placed on PDR form. This is to verify the book qualifies for county judging. **Books without verification will be turned away.**

Schedule:

Drop off: Books may be dropped off at the 4-H office Friday, July 24 **before 5 p.m. with the names of judges.** Otherwise, they will be accepted at the Hall 8:30 - 9 a.m. **Saturday, July 25.**

(No late books will be accepted.)

Judging: Approximately 9:30 a.m.

RECORD BOOKS DUE TO YOUR CLUB

Remember, the time spent doing your 4-H book will become very helpful when you're filling out college applications. **You can access the forms either by visiting our website www.ceshasta.ucdavis.edu or through your community club leader. Be sure to ask when your book is due to your club.**

If you receive a **gold seal at the club level judging** you are eligible to compete at the **County Level Book Judging, July 25.** Books will be judged on it's entirety by grade division with no limit on number of medals given. A copy of the forms are available from you community leader.

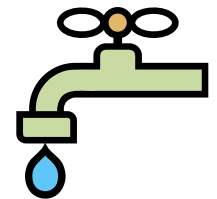


4-H Summer Camp is Early Again!

Strong Families Matter

4-H has long recognized the powerful influence families have on young people's development. As recent studies confirm that family strengths are associated with significantly better outcomes for adolescents in both lower-income and higher income families. Family strengths include emotional/subjective strengths (such as close and caring parents); behavioral/concrete strengths (for example, parental monitoring and parent involvement); and passive parenting strengths (for instance, positive parental role modeling). A new Child Trends brief, [Exploring The Links Between Family Strengths and Adolescent Outcomes](#), reports several key findings:

- * Adolescents who reported having close and caring parents are significantly more likely to perform well in school. Higher parental monitoring and parent involvement are also associated with better school performance.
- * These patterns were found in both lower- and higher-income families.
- > Adolescents in families with higher parental monitoring are more likely to avoid risky behaviors. Also, risky behaviors are significantly lower when parents are more close and caring and more involved.
- * These patterns were found for both lower- and higher-income families.
- > 4-H Youth Development Programs that value family involvement and focus on building family strengths can provide yet another protective factor for young people's positive youth development.
